## **Family Hub blog:**

'Building in SEND, not bolting it on...'

"I have been thinking about the recent SEND workshop and our work to develop a Family Hub offer. Something I really took away from it was about the concept of not just bolting on some SEND work but instead, how we build it in. It is sometimes all too easy to create an offer for families, in good faith, that ends up feeling like SEND opportunities are too separate and that the rest of the offer isn't then available for all.

I aspire to create an offer whereby families can access whatever they wish to and for us to be able to ensure that it is all accessible. Reading through the key messages from families with lived experiences in the NCFHs SEND module, they really made me think about how we need to ensure that SEND families are a crucial part of the consultation and design processes but also the ongoing governance for Family Hubs. We need to ensure that we capture and consider those living with SEND as we continue to shape our offer to our communities".

## **NCFH SEND update:**

The first SEND Community of Practice took place last month. The group will meet once every two months and hope to create a forum for discussion that will be useful for others.

Discussion in the initial meeting was wide ranging, but mainly focused on the importance of co-design of services, including: family led principles and practice; the language we agree to use; and the effectiveness of provision made for young people in co-production with young people within a young offenders setting. The strength in families owning their own narrative was also highlighted. 'Only *having* to tell their story once' may be a more useful way to describe the principle of efficient information sharing. This would mean that a family could have confidence that professionals will understand their context and needs, once they have initially shared their details with a professional. However, a family should have an entitlement to retell their story if it helps them – telling their story because they *can*, not because they *have to*.

Don't forget to take the opportunity to make a response to the DfE's Green Paper consultation; **SEND Review, Right Support, Right Place, Right Time**. The deadline is the 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2022. Where you can, think from a family hub perspective when you are drafting your answers. There are lots of questions in the SEND module to help shape your thinking.
