In Today's Update:

- 1. <u>DfE</u>: DfE annual report published, dashboard of educational outcomes 15 years after leaving school, updated HAF programme guidance.
- 2. <u>Research</u>: Wider life experiences help to improve adolescent mental health, facial hair and fighting.
- 3. <u>News:</u> DfE misses £10million in VAT refunds, debunking claim teachers in top 10% of earners, analysis of 2020 and 2021 reference tests, knowledge, power and the curriculum, Christmas and having an eating disorder, High Court rejects challenge to RSE curriculum. And for the end of the year: review of the year with the Institute of Government and educational reads of the year.

1. DfE:

- The department's annual report sets out achievements and summarises its accounts, as well as the department's priorities and risks. - Department launches long-term educational outcomes dashboard. 2. Research:

- Pulling together key evidence from across neuroscience and psychology to demonstrate that wider life experiences for adolescents could be vital to address declining mental health. These can include volunteering, taking responsibility, and new experiences. - Additional analysis comparing results in English and maths National Reference Tests in 2020 and 2021.
