Matthew Brazier



HMI, Specialist Adviser (Looked After Children) and Project Director, Supported Accommodation (Children in Care and Care Leavers) at Ofsted. Matthew Brazier is a qualified social worker and registered with Social Work England. He is Ofsted's specialist adviser for looked after children. As part of Ofsted's social care policy team, he has led on the development and implementation of the social care common inspection framework and co-led Ofsted's research into matching in foster care. He also carries out inspections of children's services in local authorities and has led several thematic inspections relating to children in care. Before joining Ofsted, Matthew gained more than 20 years' post-qualifying experience as a manager and social worker within local authority children's services.



Mark Riddell MBE is the National Implementation Adviser for Care Leavers at the Department for Education. Mark has recently written about national care leavers week 'As the National Adviser for Care Leavers, it is a real celebration that every year, we have Care Leavers' week. This brings together care experienced people to celebrate, have fun and attend events. But we also have to remember that being in care and leaving care are the biggest challenges that these children and young people face. I know this all too well from my own care experience'.







David Graham

Since 2010 David has been National Director of The Care Leavers Association working to improve the lives of care leavers of all ages. Before this he was an Assistant Director at The Big Life Group – a social enterprise in the North West supporting disadvantaged communities in the areas of employment, health, housing, education and community development. The focus of his early employment was working with young people in a range of community settings. He has also managed community centres in various parts of the UK. For most of his working life David has worked with communities using a user-led approach – striving to ensure that the voices of individuals and communities are at the heart of all decision making and service provision. In his limited free time David lives in the countryside of Yorkshire, enjoys his garden and still supports the football team from the red side of Manchester.



Dr Jenny Molloy, BASW England Patron is an author and a motivational speaker. The author of 'Hackney Child', and "Tainted Love" under her pen name Hope Daniels, she spent most of her childhood in care, and is now a married Mother, Grandmother, and of course, a care leaver. Jenny was under the Care of Hackney Social Services, and was known as a "Hackney Child", hence the book name.
