Councils join forces to recruit more foster carers

Councils from across the South East have come together to create the country's largest local authority fostering partnership, in a bid to increase the number of foster carers across the region.

With over 11,000 children in care across the South East, and fewer than 3,000 local authority approved foster carers, there is an urgent need to recruit more people to provide safe, loving, and local homes for vulnerable children.

Bracknell Forest Council is the lead for the fostering recruitment hub on behalf of the region. It has been a collaborative effort working with partner local authorities to deliver this fantastic new fostering hub.

Launching today, Monday 8 July, Local Authority Fostering South East is a new virtual fostering hub bringing together the expertise of 20 councils from across the region.

The new hub will make sure that prospective foster carers have access to a centralised platform for their initial enquiries about fostering. It will see local authorities work together to provide the best support, right from the start of a carer's fostering journey.

The new regional hub will be running marketing campaigns to raise awareness of this unique role and encourage more people to take the next step in becoming a foster carer with their local council. In doing so, they will benefit from comprehensive local training, generous financial assistance, and ongoing support from a non-profit organisation.

South East Regional Strategic Lead, said:

"This is a really exciting time for fostering. For the first time in the South East, we are leveraging the collective skills, knowledge, resources and support of 20 local authorities to make sure children and young people have a stable home, in a loving family, which they all deserve.

"The new hub will make this possible by increasing the number of local foster carers and making sure they are well supported through their recruitment journey and beyond.

"I would urge anyone interested in fostering to get in touch with us to find out more about becoming a foster carer with your local authority."

Councillor Roy Bailey, Executive Member for Children and Young People, said:

"We are delighted to be working with our partner local authorities as part of this ground-breaking, collaborative approach to foster carer recruitment.

"With the declining number of foster carers, and the increased need for them by vulnerable children, we hope this funding will help us to shine a light on the desperate need for foster families and the incredible work they do to support those who need it the most.

"All children deserve to feel happy, safe and loved. The new hub will make sure we can find as many homes as possible for children who need them. We also hope it will encourage more people to become foster carers."

Local authorities host new minister's first fostering visit



Twenty local authorities in the South East have hosted a visit from newly appointed Minister Janet Daby MP.

The visit from the Labour MP for Lewisham East, and former children's social worker, follows the launch of <u>Local Authority Fostering South East</u>. This is a Department for Education (DfE) funded project to recruit more foster carers across the region. The project has become the largest local authority fostering recruitment hub in the country.

Minister Daby met with foster carers, care-experienced young people and representatives from Local Authority Fostering South East. The visit took place in Time Square, Bracknell Forest, on Wednesday 31 July.

The minister heard about the Mockingbird support programme for foster carers, and the new innovative approach to foster carer recruitment. This includes the joint marketing campaigns running across the region to attract more people willing to take on this life-changing role. It is Daby's first engagement with fostering services since becoming Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State in the DfE.

Janet Daby, Minister for Children and Families, said:

"We know that there's a growing demand for foster placements across the country and we must do more to recruit and retain more foster carers.

"I met with the South East's newly launched recruitment and retention hub team to find out how they will offer support to prospective foster carers, improve the transition to becoming a carer and encourage more people to foster children.

"I encourage anyone with an interest in fostering in the area to get in touch to find out more and help to give children growing up in care every possible opportunity for better life chances."



Press Release, for Local Authorities to share in their community

Local authority fostering South East (LAFSE) has successfully been approved funding for a 2nd year by the Department of Education.

Our first year saw the creation of a hub to bring together 20 local authorities in the South East to increase fostering recruitment in our region. We worked collaboratively to create a centralised CRM system, a centralised phone system, regional marketing, regional data reporting, shared training sessions, employing foster ambassadors and various events to bring us together. We spoke to over 3,000 people about fostering, with 20% going to initial visit and 10% into assessment.

This year, LAFSE are creating an even bigger team to strengthen our offering further, alongside partnering with CareFriends to boost recruitment and conversion, creating a wider marketing plan, strengthening harmonisation practices and the hub taking initial visits – all with the key aim of recruiting more foster carers.
